At the Square Harden we gathered with the crowd to hear Ruth Davis, the famous missionary, telling about her trip to the Far East.

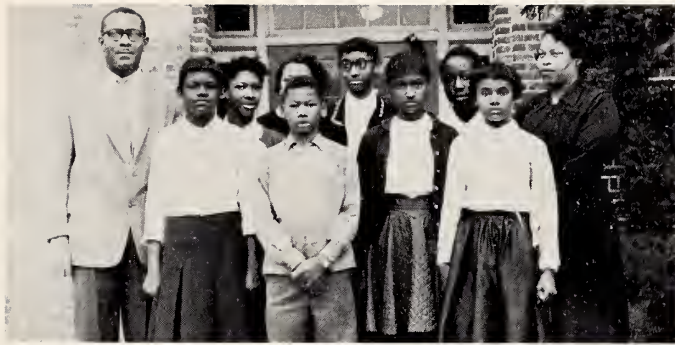
